SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Mike off) to adjourn, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, I do.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wehrbein, if we might just delay this for just a minute to make sure we have everyone's letter, request in for priority bills.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That would be my intention, too.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wickersham has amendments to LB 698 to be printed; and Senator Hefner, amendments to LB 199 to be printed. (See page 1116 of the Legislative Journal.)

A confirmation report from the Natural Resources Committee, signed by Senator Johnson who is Chair of the committee. The bills read on Final Reading this morning have been presented to the Governor, Mr. President. (Re: LB 36, LB 100, LB 313, LB 330, LB 354, LB 837. See page 1117 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, a series of priority bill designations. Senator Moore has selected LB 503 as his priority bill. Senator Rasmussen selected LB 701. Senator Hefner LR 10CA. Senator Hartnett selected LB 773. Senator Schrock has selected LB 754. Senator Hartnett, as Chair of the Urban Affairs Committee, LB 764. Senator Wesely, as Chair of Health and Human Services, LB 836 and LB 678. Revenue Committee selected LB 662 and LB 829. The Ag Committee LB 312, and the Natural Resources Committee LB 406 and LB 338. Senator Schmit LB 470.

Finally, Mr. President, Senator Pirsch would like to withdraw her name as co-introducer of LB 789, and Senator Schmit would like to add his name to LR 10. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Wehrbein, do you wish to state your motion, please?
