They lost to the eventual champions from Oklahoma City. But this basketball team, it has, you know, four of the starters on this basketball team are from Nebraska. Three of them happen to be from Senator Schimek's district, being graduates of Lincoln Southeast, the other Nebraska starter comes from Senator Lamb's district, from Anselmo-Myrna High School. As I mentioned, it's the first time in school history that they were at the NAIA. They only have two graduating seniors, we hope they're back next year. Probably most importantly of all, they set an example by the combined team GPA, it's a 3.2 GPA, which I think is something we can all be proud of. So I ask for adoption of the resolution.
