LB 586, 782

With regard to this particular item I don't think there could be any argument but that an increase in the fees is justified just to retain the policy we put in place in 1971. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. We will now vote on the motion, the Beutler amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 21 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment fails.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 586 to E & R for grossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 586. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 586 is advanced. We will pass over LB 400. We'll proceed with Item 7 on the agenda, General File, LB 782.

CLERK: Madam President, 782 is a bill introduced by Senators Kristensen and Crosby. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to the Banking Committee, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 782 raises from five to six the number of auxiliary branches that a bank may have inside of city limits. Originally the bill indicated the number went from five to eight. The committee decided that since there was a need to expand, particularly under the course of conduct evidence at the hearing, in this bill in the Lincoln area, that that number could reasonably be made six rather than eight so the committee amendments reduces from eight to six the number of branches that a bank can have in the city limits. I would urge its adoption.
