

to do one or the other next session, address the issue at that point. With that, I would support the Hall amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. Is there anyone else who wishes to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing? Closing is waived. We will vote on the Hall amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Hall's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. We will now discuss the committee amendments, themselves. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Madam President, Senator Hall, I just have a couple of questions on some of these. From the explanation that you went down, that you gave us, the one on the flea markets, number two.

SENATOR HALL: Um-hm.

SENATOR CROSBY: Do I understand that like, for instance, at Pershing Auditorium, they have a flea market once a month, who is the one that gets the sales tax certificate? I just don't quite understand that one. Maybe you can explain it to me so I can understand it.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Crosby, the issue of the permit would be governed by the entity where the flea market is being conducted. In other words, if Pershing, the example that you used, rents out their space for flea market, they would get a sales tax permit for the entire operation, so that the individual vendors, the individual booth operators would not have to have a sales tax permit.

SENATOR CROSBY: Oh, each person doesn't have to have one?

SENATOR HALL: Correct.

SENATOR CROSBY: Now they do?

SENATOR HALL: No.
