LB 400

SENATOR WARNER: Yeah, Mr. President. It occurred to me, when I was listening to Senator Schellpeper, to request a ruling on germaneness, maybe to save the body time I would withdraw the amendment at this point to see if it's germane, Senator Haberman's amendment is germane rather than go ahead and discuss this while we're...until we know that issue. So I temporarily withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Haberman, do you wish to discuss the germaneness issue?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, I do, Mr. President. In LB 400 the Nebraska Rural Health Advisory Commission is mentioned on page 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, and 12. That's how many times it is mentioned in LB 400. In the amendment, the amendment states the Nebraska Rural Health Advisory Commission will be involved, and is involved in this amendment to LB 400. My amendment directly addresses everything that is in LB 400. And I would say, Mr. President, it is germane.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Haberman. The ruling from the Chair will be that the amendment is not germane. I'm ruling that it is not germane. You may challenge that, if you wish to, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Although I think you're wrong, Mr. President, I will not challenge the Chair.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator Wesely, you want to withdraw yours, Senator, is that right?

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend. Senator, this is, this is a package, is that...1044, 1047 is one, is that what you want to do? Just so I'm in sync with you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The one marked A, which has 1044 on the front...

CLERK: Yes.
