Doctor for the Day today is Dr. Dan Halm, from Omaha. And he is from Senator Ashford's district. Would you please stand and be welcomed by the Legislature. And in the south balcony we have some guests of Senator Rod Johnson. There are seven seniors from Hampton with their instructor. Would you folks please stand and be welcomed by the Legislature. That's the least we can do for you, after you sat through that Final Reading. We will go to LR 65. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. LR 65 was introduced on behalf of the Nebraska Jaycees, recognizing their good work over the years in trying to develop our young leaders in the State of Nebraska. They had government day, last April 5th, last week, and this is recognizing that day and also encouraging citizens to recognize the good work of the Nebraska Jaycees, an organization I belong to, one I admire and respect. They had the good sense to name me outstanding young man, a few years ago, so they obviously know what they're doing. And I ask support for this resolution.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there discussion or objection? I'm not sure which to ask for. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I'm reading this resolution, on page 1566, and it continues to the top of page 1567, and the two words up there are "laid over", then immediately under that are these words, "Mr. Wesely asked unanimous consent to be excused, no objection, so ordered." That would be good advice for him right now.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any other discussion? Senator Wesely, you probably wouldn't dare close, would you? No. We will now proceed to vote on LR 65. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 65.

SPEAKER BAACK: LR 65 is adopted. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 161. Mr. Clerk, we'll go to General File and LB 320.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 320 was introduced by Senators Landis, Rogers, Wehrbein, Lamb, Schellpeper, Coordsen, Robak and Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 16, referred
