SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schmit. Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: I'll pass at this time. Or I could call the question too, I guess. Anyone else to...I'll call the question.

SPEAKER BAACK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. We will now vote on ceasing debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on ceasing debate. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We're voting on ceasing debate. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, could I ask for a call of the house, accept call in votes and, if necessary, have a roll call?

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. We are voting on ceasing debate and call in votes have been authorized. We are voting on ceasing debate. Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you please check in. Senator Conway. Senator Lynch, would you please check in. We are looking for Senator Chambers. We are voting on ceasing debate and call in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Rod Johnson voting yes. Senator Nelson voting yes.
