

buttons to tell these agencies that we are concerned on how you're spending your money and you'd better be spending it right or we're going to come down on you and we're going to come down on you hard. Please support my amendment, let's start now sending the message we want to be accountable, we're concerned about how all of our money is spent, large sums and small sums and we're ready to vote that way right now. I would like to give Senator Schimek just a minute of my time, the remainder, Madam Chair.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Madam President and members of the body, I would just like to rise in support of Senator Morrissey's attempt on this matter. I sat in the committee that heard this and I think he has valid justification for bringing this to our attention again. I would also like to say that I concur with what Senator Schmit said on the floor this morning and I think it's time that we seriously consider some kind of a performance audit or review, whether it's done by state auditor or whether it's done by the Legislature itself. I think the time is overdue. I think the Nebraska public is astounded by what has been going in state government recently.

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And I just want to go on record in favor of that kind of procedure for all of the programs that we have in state government. And, Senator Morrissey, I just commend you for bringing this to our attention again and working on it so hard, and I will be voting to support it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. You've now heard closing on the Morrissey amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I would like to ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Have a motion for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
