LB 836, 836A

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 836 is advanced. LB 836A.

CLERK: 836A was a bill introduced by Senator Wesely and Rasmussen. (Read title.) I do have an amendment to the bill offered by Senator Wesely, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Madam President, this, because the Commission on the Status of Women is no longer administering the grant program, we need to make the change to transfer the money over to the Department of Social Services. That's all the amendment does.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will vote on the Wesely amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Wesely amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely, would you like to open on the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, again, the money for this program is coming from the federal government in block grants that they passed last fall. I do want to note though, this Legislature has been very good about funding the Title XX improvements last year and the year before. We needed to do that. That was state monies, so we have done our share and now I'm glad to see the federal money available to do this program and move for the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Is there anyone who wishes to debate this bill? Seeing none, we will vote on the motion to advance LB 836A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 836A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 836A is advanced. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?
