Page 2, line 16 add after "state", insert "or the executive director", Pat, and then strike that word to restore the stricken language in the rest of the amendment. Mr. Speaker, does Senator Pirsch have to...I think I'm out of order. I think she has to...

SENATOR PIRSCH: I think I'll have to withdraw my amendment then.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn. Have you given the Clerk a copy of the amendment?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Not yet. We wrote it so quick it's the only copy I have.

SPEAKER BAACK: We'll just stand at ease till we get a copy. We are going to temporarily pass over LB 186 as they work on an amendment for that and we will pass over 186A at the same time and we'll go to LB 227, but before we do that I would like to introduce some guests of the Legislature. They are guests of Senator Owen Elmer. There are seven fifth and sixth graders from the Beaver Valley School in Danbury and Wilsonville and their teachers and they are in the south balcony. Would you folks please stand and be welcomed by the Legislature. Thank you for being with us. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 73, LR 74, and LR 75. (See page 1929 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. Clerk, LB 227.
