

are not the same samples, or these are not the same tobacco product that we'd find on the shelves for sale. So I do want you to keep that in mind. And I'm not going to belabor it a lot, but in 1989 we had 132 new cases of oral cancer in Nebraska, which resulted in I'm not sure how many deaths in '89. In 1986 we had 51 deaths, in 1957 we had 38 contributed directly to this. And so it's a much, much more serious than even cigarettes. They're about six times more addictive and the nitrosamines are much, much worse. So I just will support anything that...Senator Chambers on this. And retail outlets, that's been the problem all along. These samples were given out with no control. Sure, it's nice to say we did try to control them at the State Fair, we did try to control them at Husker Harvest Days and so on, but it isn't only the kids that we're concerned about. But it was impossible to control the giving of these samples.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Is there anyone else who wishes to debate this issue? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam Chair, Senator Baack and I are working on something, so I'm going to withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Is there anything further on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator, I now have your second amendment to the committee amendments which would strike lines 17 and 18.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Madam President and members of the Legislature, lines 17 and 18 of the committee amendments contain the following words, "a private industrial production site, or a construction site". And a construction site is defined, on page 2 of the green copy of the bill, in lines 9 through 12. Construction site shall mean a location and the area adjacent to it at which a company or business is engaged in constructing a building, dwelling, or other structure. So there are construction sites, and I don't know whether it violates child labor laws or not, where minors will be found. They don't have to be working there, they can be bringing food to the workers, and they might be working there. But if all of this bill is designed to restrict this activity to consenting adults and limit the activity to locations where minors are not allowed to be, we should eliminate the language that I'm trying to get
