CLERK: Senator, first order of business on 703 are E & R amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 703.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to amend. Senator, I have AM461 in front of me.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Have that one withdrawn.

CLERK: I'm sorry, Senator.

SENATOR WESELY: Withdraw that one, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: That one is withdrawn. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, this amendment puts into the statute provisions dealing with the Health Department and carrying out the Critical Incident Stress Debriefing program. We had a bill, LB 412, that was heard, advanced unanimously by the Legisla...to the Legislature by the Health and Human Services Committee.
