that are actually going to end up saving money for the state. There is contained within 1059, as it passed, a requirement that the Department of Revenue provide adjustments annually in local land appraisals for purposes of distributing state aid and we're going to consider delaying or abolishing that. So by the time we get 719 across the board, it will be a relatively revenue neutral measure, but in order to fund the provisions of the bill that were added on General File we do need to advance this A bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the advancement of LB 719A. Seeing none, Senator Withem, do you wish to close?

SENATOR WITHEM: I waive closing.

SPEAKER BAACK: Waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 719A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the advancement of LB 719A. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 719A.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 719A advances. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 850 and LB 852. Item 7 on the agenda. Mr. Clerk, LB 470.

CLERK: Mr. President, 470 was a bill introduced by Senator Schmit. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to Banking Committee. It was discussed on the floor of the Legislature on April 9. At that time, Mr. President, committee amendments were adopted. There was an amendment to the bill by Senator Landis that was adopted. Senator Hall then made a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill. Senator Schmit agreed to lay the bill over. Senator Hall's motion to indefinitely postpone is now pending.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw that.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.
