SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Good morning, and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. With us this morning for the prayer we have Pastor Fred Tedder, from the Church of the Nazarene in Omaha. Pastor. Pastor Tedder.
