

SENATOR MOORE: ...drivers license.

SENATOR ASHFORD: No.

SENATOR MOORE: It would not be like a drivers license where a uniform buyers permit card.

SENATOR ASHFORD: There's a certificate, it's a uniform...it's a uniform form, and it may be necessary...

SENATOR MOORE: But for application, but as far as the actual piece of paper that says...

SENATOR ASHFORD: (Interrupted, inaudible.)

SENATOR MOORE: ...I can buy a gun, that is not going to be uniform?

SENATOR ASHFORD: Yes, it is going to be uniform, and it would be issued by the state. But it would be implemented and operated on a local level. There may be some...I think it was estimated 2 to 4 thousand dollars in the fiscal note for the state to put the forms together, the certificates together. So I...you know, that's the fiscal note as it now stands. It would be somewhat less, I suppose, if it's every three years.

SENATOR MOORE: I guess my...my...the only...I'm trying to get a handle on the cost of something that's going to be...if it's a permit that...it's going to be somewhat like a drivers license then, because...

SENATOR ASHFORD: It is.

SENATOR MOORE: ...it's issued by the state, I mean it's a uniform state buyers card, but it's actually issued and administered by local government.

SENATOR ASHFORD: That's correct.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay. But in your opinion that does not cost.

SENATOR ASHFORD: You know I think there is obviously very, small incremental cost.
