SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. LB 355 is advanced. We will proceed on to Select File and, since Senator Schmit and Senator Beutler are currently excused, we will move to LB 549, the Nebraska Retirement Systems Committee bill, change provisions for the state administered retirement plans. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, before that, amendments to be printed to LB 718 by Senator Johnson. Study resolutions, LR 101-106, all will be referred to the Reference Committee. (See pages 2201-05 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have Enrollment and Review amendments, first of all, on 549.

SENATOR CONWAY: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 549.

SENATOR CONWAY: All in favor of adoption of the E & R amendments signify by saying aye. Opposed. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Baack. I have a note that he wishes to withdraw the amendment.

SENATOR CONWAY: Senator Baack.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, I would like to withdraw that.

SENATOR CONWAY: The amendments are withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nelson would move to amend. The amendment is on page 2104 of the Journal.

SENATOR CONWAY: Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. Speaker, if the members of the body would recall, LB 549 is what I would call the general clean-up bill for the Retirement, the Nebraska Retirement Systems. In general, it is not...it's a big bill but changes the word from "salary" to "compensation"; gives a little bit more oversight, changes the fees and the material that they get from the local school boards. But I don't think that there is any controversy
