SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That's what I am going to do. That goes to the main bill and I'm going to have to ask Senator Hall to answer it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, do you want to wait on those because I've got several questions relating to the money and the need for...

SENATOR HALL: I'd be happy to answer them.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right. Senator Hall, then, please.

SENATOR HALL: Or try to. Roger, it would raise approximately, the city's estimates were one to \$2 million a year that they would raise through the keno lottery.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And how long would this go on? Let's say...I guess maybe I'll back up and say why is it necessary to do this? Can you bring money on line this fast and hold that team there
