SENATOR HALL: Mr. Speaker, could I have a call of the house, and then a roll call vote on this issue. I think it's important to get people on the record.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

Thank you for being with us. We are now looking for Senator Lynch. All members are now present. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment by Senator Hall, and roll call vote has been requested. I might request that my colleagues keep their conversations down so the Clerk can hear the roll. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2246 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.
