LB 262, 427, 617, 619, 627, 719, 840

CLERK: 10 ayes, 18 nays, Madam President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We had a request for a record vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 2419-20 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 18 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. Okay, there is nothing further on the bill. I will remind the senators we are on Final Reading, would they please return to their seats. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 427 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 427 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2421 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 6 nays, 6 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 427 passes with the emergency clause. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk? We are finished with Final Reading, the call is raised.

CLERK: Madam President, amendments to be printed, Senator Hartnett to LB 719; and Senator Kristensen to LB 262. I have an Attorney General's Opinion to Senator Lowell Johnson to insert. (Re: LB 840.) Your Committee on Government, whose Chair is Senator Conway, reports LB 617 and LB 619 to General File with committee amendments attached, both signed by Senator Conway as Chair of the committee, and that is all that I have, Madam President. PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We will proceed with General File, LB 627.

CLERK: Madam President, 627 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23, referred to the Revenue Committee, advanced to
