SENATOR LAMB: Sixteen. Well, it doesn't make much difference whether it is 16 or 18, still way too many. I'd ask unanimous consent to withdraw the motion at this point.

PRESIDENT MOUL: That is out of order, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay, we will just run it.
