There was an amendment attached to the bill, I believe it was Senator Moore at that time, to address a concern of the companies that provide detasslers in the hybrid seed corn production area in Nebraska. These detasslers are customarily high school and college students looking for a little extra money during a short period of time in the summertime. And so the bill, as amended and passed into law in 1987 provided for that by reading that any operation which employs individuals domiciled within 50 miles of a location, and it goes on, and there was a point made that, by one company, that if they hired one person that lived within 50 miles then they could go ahead and employ migrant labor for the rest of the work and escape the provisions of the Farm Labor Contractors Act. So this bill was brought to Business and Labor Committee over a year ago to correct this particular error in language and it adds to the Farm Labor Contractors Act provision, and the words are just "who are all domiciled within 50 miles of the location where the labor is performed" to ensure that this, the intent of the act, was not violated by people because of a contrary question over the language that was contained in it. So all that LB 352 (sic) does is reinforce the Legislature's intent from about four years ago when this act was enacted and it changes the language. So, with that, I would urge the adoption of a bill or the advancement of the bill and would respond to any questions. Thank you, Madam President.
