Former State Senator Ron Cope from District 36 passed away yesterday. He was a member of the Legislature from 1975 to 1982. Our condolences to his family. Now, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 209. We will proceed with General File.

CLERK: Madam President, the first bill for consideration by the Legislature this morning is LB 858. It was introduced by Senator Warner who is chairperson of the Executive Board. It is a revisor's bill. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred directly to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, the first 14 bills as you note on the Agenda are revisor statute bills. I'll just give you a brief explanation of what they are. LB 858 provides amendments in Volume 5 and 5a. Incidentally, these explanations have been passed out and are on your desk if you wish to refer to them, so I'll be fairly brief in my description. But what this particular bill does is it removes the words this act in a number of places in these two volumes where it appears more than twice within a section, and this is to assist with the computer version of the statutes so that those notes that this act do not appear in so many places. I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 858. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the motion to advance LB 858? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 858.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 858 is advanced. LB 859.

CLERK: 859, introduced by Senator Warner as Chairperson of the Exec. Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred directly to General File, Madam President.
