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to do that and leave the area. But this seemed like a reasonable compromise, would make it possible for our Clerk and others who are concerned about order, especially during Final Reading, and also those of us concerned with the order on the floor during the reading on Final...during the action on Final Reading. So I would respectfully submit this to you...to the body for its consideration and recommend its adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I'm opposed to this rule change and I will apply what I'm saying only to myself. Whether it applies to anybody else on the floor or not, I have no way of knowing. However, I have seen others do what I do and that is to go to my office and work when extended discussion occurs during Final Reading on some proposition. If it's one of those instances that Senator Lynch mentioned where an individual states that a motion is being offered to return only for the purpose of making a comment, then the motion will be withdrawn, I will stay here. But there have been some very deep and lengthy discussions of various bills on Final Reading. During that time, I have left the Chamber, I don't go to the lounge and the environs which consists of the hallway connecting the Chamber and the lounge is not sufficient territory for me to operate in, nor are the things there that I need for the purposes that I have in mind. Perhaps I have more calls from people, more other things that are requested of me from people not even in my district than other senators. But I spend a lot of time in my office working. I come down here practically every day when we're not in session. That does not exclude Saturday, Sunday and holidays. I can understand the desire for order but order is not always the paramount consideration when we deal with a serious issue. If we would apply it to governments and how they function, the government that can maintain the most order is the government that denies to citizens the most freedom and liberty. Whenever order is imposed it is done at the expense of some freedom or liberty being taken away. So what a few senators would want to do by offering this motion is to confine everybody to the area that they can operate in without any problem. I would not say that we should require any senator to do the kind of work that I do. We couldn't do it anyway. Nobody would accept a job that placed as a requirement the types of things that I do. If I sought a job and one of the requirements is that I work the way that I work, the number of hours that I work, do the driving
