SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. This morning, for the prayer this morning we have Pastor Thomas Saddler from the Christ Temple Mission Church in Lincoln. Pastor Saddler.

PASTOR SADDLER: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Pastor Saddler. I now call to order the ninth day of the Ninety-Second Legislature, Second Session. Roll call. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any items for the record?

CLERK: Just one, and LR 223 is ready for your signature, Mr. President. That's all that I have.

SPEAKER BAACK: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 223. (See page 381 of the Legislative Journal.) Introduction of new bills.

CLERK: I have none at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay, we will now proceed to Item 6, legislative resolution, LR 224 by Senator Bernard-Stevens.

CLERK: Mr. President, 224 offered by Senator Bernard-Stevens is found on page 349 of the Journal. (Read brief description.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body, actually if you'll look closely at the resolution as the Clerk stated, it's more of a resolution of talking about the young people that are involved statewide, that they are getting the opportunity to learn about the system and it simply sends a thank you to those that have put the number of hours in helping
