CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 734 advances. We'll now go to LB 711.

CLERK: Mr. President, 711 was a bill introduced by Senator Ashford. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 23 of last year, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Senator...or...or I, Mr. President, just wish we'd pass over that.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will pass over LB 711. And we'll proceed to LB 28.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 28 was a bill introduced by Senator Bernard-Stevens. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President. LB 28 amends what is now Section 28-1417 by simply adding firefighters and emergency medical service providers to those officials of political subdivisions who are indemnified if any legal action is brought against them based upon negligent error, or omission while in the performance of his or her lawful duties. It was something that was on before. Somewhere in the writing, in years past, it was inadvertently left off, and we're simply making that correction at this time. And I'd urge the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on the advancement of LB 28? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Bernard-Stevens? Waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 28. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 28.
