SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you Senator Rogers. We will now vote on the committee amendments to LB 366. Or, if there is any discussion on the committee amendments. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, we will now vote on the committee amendments to LB 366. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 366. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: The committee amendments are adopted. We will now go to the bill as amended. Senator Rod Johnson, would you like to speak on the bill as amended?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, briefly, having helped work on the Grain Warehouse Act back when I was Chairman of the Agriculture Committee I guess I would rise in support of the bill as amended. At the time when we first were working on this particular proposal we had a number of warehouses that went bankrupt and a number of people who had grain in those warehouses that were hurt financially and I think any steps we can take to assure public protection of those inventories I think is beneficial. So I would rise in support of the bill which gives the Public Service Commission the ability to do hopefully a good job of regulating our many warehouses in the state.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Rod Johnson. Anyone else wishing to speak to the advancement of LB 366? Seeing no one, Senator Rogers, do you wish to close on the advancement?

SENATOR ROGERS: I waive closing.

SPEAKER BAACK: Closing has been waived. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 366. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the advancement of LB 366. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 366.
