SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President. Through the debate on General File we came up with the two amendments that would clarify the two areas that were of concern, one that I had. The bill simply now states, no person shall knowingly sell or offer for sale firefighting equipment that's not up to the standards. We also put in the word "transfer", so we're talking about transfer, sell, or offer to sell. In Section 2 we do the same thing, we put in "knowingly accept", firefighter departments, or firefighters shall not knowingly accept any item that would be not up to standard. And we'd also put an amendment on Section 3 in a concern that Senator Beutler had, which was a legitimate concern. And at this point the misdemeanor would apply to both Section 1 and Section 2. And that's the nature of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Any discussion on the Bernard-Stevens amendment? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Bernard-Stevens? Waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment offered by Senator Bernard-Stevens. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
