ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 867 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 867 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 652 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 39 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 8 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 867 passes. We'll go to LB 868.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 868 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 868 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 652-53 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 37 ayes, 0 nays, 4 present and not voting, 8 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 868 passes. We will now proceed to Item 7 on the agenda, General File, 1991 senator priority bill, LB 291.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 291 was a bill originally introduced by Senators Beyer, Rogers, Crosby, Hefner, Lowell Johnson, Dennis Byars, Peterson, Schellpeper, Wehrbein, Pirsch, and Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 15 of 1991, at that time referred to Transportation Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Transportation Committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The Chair of the Transportation Committee, Senator Kristensen.
