CLERK: LB 308A, introduced by Senator Lynch. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Well, as we already discussed appropriately, and I won't dwell on it any longer, the Department of Health suggests and asks that they have a part-time health coordinator. And the total cost, including the benefit costs along with the salary would be \$20,616. I will ask for your support for that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any discussion on LB 308A? Seeing none, Senator Lynch, do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 308A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 308A.
