CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

SPEAKER BAACK: The confirmation report of the Education Cmmittee is adopted. We will now proceed to Item 7 on the agenda, LB 677A.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 677A is a bill introduced by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. LB 677 deals with long-term care ombudsman and sets up a voluntary ombudsman program. To train those volunteers, the A bill was necessary. There is \$1,000 about in General Fund for next year, 8,000 General Fund the following year to...or I guess that is a biennium...following year to deal with the training of these individuals. It is not a lot of money but it would help provide for these volunteers to have training across the state. And with that, I'd move for the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the advancement of LB 677A. Seeing none, do you wish to close? Senator Wesely waives closing. We will now vote on the advancement of LB 677A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 677A.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 677A advances. We will go to LB 734A.

CLERK: LB 734A by Senator Hall. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. The A bill accompanies LB 734, which was introduced last year. It deals with a proposal that came out of the Property Tax Assessment Commission that was run the previous year in 1990. It seeks to put in place a statewide data file with regard to sales of property to help the assessors throughout the state in the various counties when they are looking at different types of
