CLERK: 12 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment to the committee amendments is adopted. Anything further on the committee amendments? Nothing further on the committee amendments. Is there discussion on the committee amendments to LB 1178? Seeing none, Senator Kristensen, would you like to close?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I believe there has been a considerable, well not a considerable, but there has been an adequate discussion of what the bill does in terms of the policies. The major changes again, the committee amendments make from the green copy is removing the requirement of the Department of Motor Vehicles to forward the information to the Department of Health and also strike out the language that says if, in these commercial driver's license or your operator's license or a state ID card, that is legal consent to give that or your legal authority. This is merely an intention, statement of your intention, thus there must be consent and that consent is done along a statutory set of priority people. To that Senator Chambers' amendment to the committee amendments now make a change that there must be an optional language placed upon that. With those changes, I would urge the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing on the committee amendments to LB 1178. We'll now vote on those amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 1178. Have you all voted? Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
