

record and then it moves that legal procedure out of the Workers' Compensation Court. I'm not comfortable with that. Our amendment that we've been working on would provide the reinstatement of the three judge panel on the record and then a further appeal to another court. That is an issue of negotiation at this point in time. So I would confirm what my three colleagues said that the bill is certainly not in shape for final passage, but I would encourage the advancement of the amend...attachment of the amendment and the advancement of the bill this afternoon. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion pending is the adoption of the committee amendments. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay, requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? Clerk, record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: Motion is carried. The amendments are adopted. Senator Coordsen, move to advance the bill, Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Move to advance the bill, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR WARNER: Is there further discussion? Seeing no lights, Senator Coordsen, do you wish to close? Senator Coordsen waives. Those in favor of advancing LB 360 vote aye, opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the motion to advance 360.

SENATOR WARNER: Motion is advanced. The bill is advanced. LB 360A, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 360A introduced by Senator Coordsen appropriates funds to implement 360.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Mr. Speaker, the A bill is, I don't even have it in front of me, just a second. Now we have one. Provides for \$140,000 for '92-93 and \$135,000 from the General Fund for '93-94 for the Workers' Compensation Court program, 530. After conference with committee counsel, I'm able to share with you that the reason for the A bill is a method of funding for the
