SENATOR WARNER: Items on the desk, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, amendments to be printed to LB 672 by
Senator Nelson; Senators Hall and Conway to LB 1135. Study
resolutions LR 282 by Business and Labor Committee; LR 283 by
Business and Labor; LR 284, all calling for interim studies.
All will be referred to the Executive Board. (See pages 1435-43
of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have,
Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Okay, LB 556, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 556 was a bill originally introduced by
Speaker Baack, along with Senators Hefner, Wesely, Beutler,
Schimek, Coordsen, Schellpeper, Morrissey. (Read title.) The
bill was introduced on January 22 of last year, at that time
referred to the Government Committee. The bill was advanced to
General File. I do have Government Committee amendments
pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Conway, for the Government Committee
amendments.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, LB 556
which was originally written in the green form was completely
rewritten by its introducer, for the most part, and he offered
that at the committee hearing for our perusal and the committee
basically acted on that rewrite. The rewrite is what's in the
book and, in essence, is the committee amendments. The
committee did have a couple of minor provisions that I will
mention later that we adjusted to. So I would like to turn the
opening over to Senator Baack, since the committee amendments,
in essence, ended up being his rewrite and he, in essence, would
be in a better position to describe that in his own words.
