

telling us to do it, and I am providing a way to do it. If you think you can get state money to do it, you might get the 19 rural senator votes to do that, but I don't think you will get 25, and I have been basically told that let's figure out a way to do it. We are giving them the mandate. We are giving them the ability to raise the money, and the feds gave us the mandate. Again, we can't get out of it. And this is strictly cash funds that pays for the bill through disposal fees to support the department and license fees, permit fees to support the department. So I can't come up with a figure what it will cost us in the future. I think through regionalization, the costs will be manageable. I'd urge you to support the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. We will now vote on the motion to advance LB 1257. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk. Record vote has been requested.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Morrissey requests a record vote. (Read. See pages 1570-71 of the Legislative Journal.) 39 ayes, 0 nays to advance LB 1257.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1257 has advanced. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk? Proceed with LB 1257A.

CLERK: Madam President, 1257A by Senator Morrissey. (Read title.) Senator Morrissey does have an amendment pending on the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: On the 1257A, again, it is cash funds, folks. Senator Moore, wherever you are at, cash funds. Senator Robinson, we are amending it from 1.75 million to 1.094 million because of the reduction in the disposal fee from two bucks a ton down to a dollar and a quarter to go to supporting the department. The rest of that will be made up by a disposal and permit, by a permit fees. I would urge adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. Senator Schmit.
