SENATOR MOORE: Senator, I mean you're editorializing of the President's wasteful and unnecessary items of pork, is that out of a newspaper article, or is that out of an actual speech, is that out of the...what was the source of those quotes I guess, Senator Wickersham?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, the President, as I understand his message, had a number of items that he generically characterized as pork and wasteful spending. The funding for the water system in Crawford just happened to be in that list.

SENATOR MOORE: Do you have that entire list, or do you have the copy of the speech? Was it a veto message, or where did those quotes come from, I guess?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, I don't have a copy of the entire list. And it was a me...as I understand it, it was a message that was delivered to Congress, and he said that he would strike those items.

SENATOR MOORE: And so the terms wasteful and unnecessary items of pork are in that message to Congress?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I believe that's correct.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay. Like I said, I have no problem standing up in support of the Crawford water system. The only thing I'm
