

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Hillman?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, no, it's an amendment, as I understand it, to Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I'm in doubt about Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Okay, would it be more comfortable if you went to your own microphone because then I want to ask you about that? Now, okay. I'm glad to hear that both Senator Lindsay and Senator Labeledz agree on Senator Hillman's amendment and I think that's a great spot to start this whole debate on one point that we can agree upon. Senator Labeledz said that she cannot support Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment and I just wanted to go over to make sure that people, I had some concern that some people weren't really hearing that they think that when people who get up who had been on particularly one side or the other, they stop listening and thinking that they're not going to hear anything new. I heard something with this resolution and the last sentence in particular, it says the members of the Legislature on both sides of the abortion issue should diligently work together to find the best possible solution for all citizens of Nebraska. Senator Labeledz, let's start with the members of the Legislature. Do you think that that's where the responsibility lies? Just that portion of the sentence.

SENATOR LABEDZ: My answer to your first question, as I was in the middle of the Chamber, was the fact that I did not support Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right, right, I knew that.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Because he strikes all the original sections and all amendments to LB 78.

SENATOR BOHLKE: I understand that, but I'm trying to...the part what I'm doing is reading the last sentence of Senator Bernard-Stevens, if you have that amendment.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, I do.
