CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to reconsider the Final Reading vote on LB 922.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion passes. I'll...remind the senators we are now back to Final Reading. Would the senators please be seated. We'll proceed with the vote on LB 922, shall 922 pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
