

where it is at \$50. Is that correct?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Schellpeper, yes, that's...that's correct.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: And that's...that's what the amendment is?

SENATOR HALL: That's what this amendment does. It changes the proposed committee amendments to increase it to 100. It leaves it at its current rate of 50 and it does address all four sections that Senator Kristensen asked about.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: But it doesn't change any other fees?

SENATOR HALL: Doesn't change any other fees.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay, thank you. I guess when you look at the \$50 figure and it actually costs 75, it just makes good sense that it needs to be increased. You shouldn't have to have the taxpayers pick up that cost if somebody loses their driver's license. And I just think that if you're going to get caught doing something, there's...if you lose that license, that some way...I realize \$100 sounds like a lot of money, but when it costs \$75 to actually process everything, I think \$50 is way too low. I think this...the committee amendments make sense. It wasn't part of my bill, it was part of LB 1095. But I think it makes sense that when you're going to raise fees that you do it so that you at least get the cost back that you have in the fee so that if you use this service, you're paying for what that service...what it costs to give that service. A lot of times we have a lot of different services out there and we do not recover what the actual cost is. This is one way to recover the actual cost. If we would only go \$75 this year and then raise it in a couple years, we could probably do that. But while you're doing it, you just as well go the extra 25 right away, then you don't have to come back within a couple years. But I have always said that if you use any service, you ought to pay for what that service costs and that's what this amendment is. And so I oppose the Hall amendment. Thank you.
