SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, he is. Madam President and colleagues, Senator Conway could not be here today so I am going to handle this resolution. This resolution is one that is...every year is handled by the Chair of the Government Committee and it is in...the Legislature takes note of National Management Week, and this year it's going to be the week commencing June 1st, and this resolution says that we should designate that week as Management Week and I would ask you to adopt the resolution.
