

These are businesses that have access to the airport, that have customers because of the existence of the airport that, in effect, are supported by the fact that the airport is there, by the fact that the Airport Authority has erected a facility that provides clients for them. I think, again, that the best thing we can do right now, until we understand fully what this does, is probably simply to not vote on the final passage of LB 126. With that, I would withdraw my motion.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. The motion is withdrawn. We will now proceed with Final Reading on LB 126. Would the senators please be seated. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 126 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 126 pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Could I ask for a call of the house, unless we're currently under call through Final Reading? If we are, could I ask that we check in and a roll call vote?

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would the senators please check in. Would the senators please record their presence. Senator Lynch, please check in. Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Cudaback. Senator Robak, Senator Hillman, Senator Wickersham, please check in. Senator Haberman, would you please return to your seat so that we can proceed with roll call. Senator Haberman. We'll proceed with roll call vote on LB 126.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2219 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President...Madam President, on the passage.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 126 does not pass. Proceed with LB 1115.

CLERK: Senator Hartnett, you had amendments, Senator, I understand you wish to withdraw. (Read LB 1115 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1115 pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all
