

All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2224 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 1 nay, 2 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1011 passes. Priority motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, I have a priority motion. Senator Hall would move to reconsider the Final Reading vote on Legislative Bill 126 taken earlier today.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members. Fight on my man, Saint Andrew said, for I am weak but not yet slain, for I'll just lie down to bleed awhile to rise to fight again, Saint Andrew said. I rise and offer the motion for this reason, Madam President. First of all, to apologize to Senator Elmer. The proposal that was in 126 was not onerous. It did not do anything that would have prevented any airport authority from operating as they do today, period. I told Senator Elmer that it was a provision that I thought would bring little controversy and it did. It was offered on February 13 as an amendment. It was adopted without opposition. I think possibly one vote, I think it was Senator Wehrbein, one vote, one red vote on that issue and that was it. Otherwise, there were 30 green lights. Because of that, because of the lobbying effort that took place, LB 126 is not going to become law and Senator Elmer, for the record, I apologize. I would ask that that reconsideration, Mr. Clerk, be withdrawn.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. The motion is withdrawn. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Can a reconsideration motion be withdrawn like that?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Chambers, a motion to reconsider can be withdrawn only with unanimous consent or a majority vote of the Legislature. He has requested to withdraw his motion to reconsider. If there are no objections, it will be withdrawn. We'll now proceed with LB 1011 (sic)...LB 718.
