PRESIDENT MOUL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MOUL: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain today is chaplain Harland Johnson.

HARLAND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Chaplain Johnson. I now call to order the sixtieth day of the Ninety-Second Legislature, Second Session. We will proceed with roll call. Please record your presence. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Journal is approved. Are there any messages, reports, or announcements?

CLERK: Madam President, bills read on Final Reading yesterday afternoon were presented to the Governor as of 4:35 p.m., yesterday afternoon. That's all that I have, Madam President. (Re. LB 754, LB 1115, LB 415, LB 1011, LB 718, LB 718A, LB 719A.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Recognize Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President, colleagues, we do have to have a motion this morning to suspend the rules to allow the reading of these bills, because they have not had our...the two-day layover that our rules require. They have had the constitutional one-day layover, so I move that we suspend the rules so we may read these bills this morning.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Speaker Baack. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to suspend rules. All of those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to suspend the rules? I'll remind the senators, we must have 30 votes for this motion. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
