PRESIDENT MOUL:     Thank you, Senator Hohenstein.     Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Madam President. I just want to make a comment. Senator Hohenstein mentioned that it is in District 17, it is now in the new District 18 and Wakefield and the Waldbaums are in District 18. Mr. Gardner and his wife now reside in District 18. I'm very glad to have them in my district and look forward to working with them, but District 17 and District 18 as you know have changed and so now Waldbaums are in District 18 instead of District 17, but Wayne State College is still in District 17. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Does anyone else wish to address this resolution? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to adopt LR 32. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of LR 32.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LR 32 is adopted. I would like to call the senators' attention to the area under the north balcony. Senator Chris Abboud of District 12 would like to recognize Dr. Don Malene of Omaha who is serving as our doctor of the day today on behalf of the Nebraska Academy of Family Physicians.
