**SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING**

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Good morning, and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. With us as chaplain today we have Pastor Melissa Draper from United Ministries in Higher Education from the University of Nebraska campus. Pastor Draper.

**CLERK:** LB 141, Mr. President, was a bill introduced by Senator Wickersham. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 7, referred to Urban Affairs, advanced to General File.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Senator Wickersham.

**SENATOR WICKERSHAM:** Thank you, Mr. President. This bill should probably get the short bill award of the year. It's only one line and it repeals a section that has been in the statute since 1957.
