**SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING**

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. With us as chaplain today we have Pastor Stanley Hagen from the Northside Seventh-Day Adventist Church here in Lincoln. Pastor Hagen.

**PASTOR HAGEN:** (Prayer offered.)

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Thank you, Pastor Hagen. I now call to order the eighteenth day of the Ninety-Third Legislature, First Session. Roll call. Record, Mr. Clerk.

**CLERK:** There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Are there any corrections to the Journal?

**CLERK:** No corrections, Mr. President.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Do you have items for the record?

**CLERK:** Enrollment and Review reports LB 81, LB 93, LB 177, LB 41, LB 66, LB 116, LB 183; LB 54, LB 35, LB 67, LB 100 to Select File, some of which have E & R amendments. Education Committee reports LB 194 as indefinitely postponed, that's signed by Senator Withem as Chair. Reports from the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority and Department of Social Services. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 444-47 of the Legislative Journal.)

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We'll now proceed to Item 5 on the agenda, and General File on LB 26.

**CLERK:** LB 26 was a bill introduced by Senator Chambers. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 7, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill at this time, Mr. President.

**SPEAKER BAACK:** Senator Chambers.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is one of the easiest bills, one of the least controversial bills that I have ever introduced and perhaps that I will ever introduce.
