from marriage certificates, birth certificates, death certificates and divorce decrees are the pieces of information that we want to make accessible to the Department of Social Services and agencies who have the authority to do adoption searches. So this amendment, just as 205, does not change the process for disclosure of information, it simply improves the access for those who are responsible for doing adoption searches. I will be glad to entertain any questions and would urge the body accept this amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rasmussen. Does anyone wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the Rasmussen amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
