

February 10, 1993 LB 16A, 105A, 105, 417

SENATOR HOHENSTEIN: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 417 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator. You've heard the motion to advance LB 417. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 417 is advanced. That completes Select File. We'll proceed with General File. LB 16A. Since Senator Lynch is not here, is there anyone who is authorized to handle this bill for him? Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes, I'm sorry, I apologize. Madam President and members of the body, this is simply reflecting the ability for the Department of Social Services to assess fees and to receive fees for the preadoption placement studies. It is a Cash Fund process and simply enables the department to receive these fees. And I would urge your acceptance of this A bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rasmussen. Does anyone wish to speak to this bill? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Rasmussen? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the motion to advance LB 16A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 16A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 16A is advanced. LB 105A.

CLERK: LB 105A introduced by Senator Robinson. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President and members of the body, yesterday we advanced LB 105 which was the medical hardship permit, and the A bill appropriates \$4,270 to the Department of Motor Vehicles in the...to the expenses that will be incurred by the bill. The funding is a one-time expense. It will be used for programming of computers, typesetting and printing of the application forms. I would urge the adoption of 105A. Thank you.
