PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I just rise to recognize the fact that the Banking Committee reported this out unanimously. The rent-to-own phenomenon has been well worthy of regulation. The original bill was a big step forward, but the measures of enforcement that are in LB 111, I am convinced, are very necessary to put meat on the bones of that original act. And I wholeheartedly endorse it and ask you to do so. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Landis. Does anyone else wish to speak to the bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 111. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 111.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 111 is advanced. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Thank you, Madam President. Natural Resources Committee, whose Chair is Senator Beutler, reports LB 553 to General File; LB 623, General File; LB 789, General File; and LB 830, General File, all signed by Senator Beutler. Judiciary, whose Chair is Senator Lindsay, reports LB 495 to General File; LB 277, General File with amendments; LB 461, General File with amendments; LB 783, General File with amendments; those signed by Senator Lindsay. In addition, amendments to be printed to LB 292 by Senator Crosby, and to LB 163 by Senator Coordsen. That's all that I have, Madam President. (See pages 638-44 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. LB 216.

CLERK: LB 216, Madam President, was introduced by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred to the Banking Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Banking Committee, Madam President.
