CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Horgan for opening on the bill itself.

SENATOR HORGAN: Thank you, Madam President. Again, LB 363 is the judges cleanup bill which allows those judges who have worked 18 years or more, but not worked 20 years, who have not had the opportunity to contribute to the system, because they stopped at 18 years, gives them the window of opportunity to buy back those two years, that we're providing the opportunity to the other judges who have more than 20 years. There's no fiscal impact to the bill, and it affects 23 judges and allows them to become fully vested in the retirement system. With that, I would waive closing, I think, and would be happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Horgan. Does anyone wish to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 363. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to advance LB 363? Please record, Mr. Clerk.
