situations. Those kids that are in that bad a shape, they're going to figure a way out, and we give them a way out in this bill. We give them a way out, so they aren't going to have to be there to be disruptive anymore. Interim study is okay. I still think we need to have people's feet to the fire. Senator Fisher, I'm glad your son was successful. Under this bill, he could still drop out. He wouldn't have the alternatives available to him now that he did then, though, we have closed some of those. And maybe the best advice would have been for him to stay in at this time. Look at this objectively. You're not mandating additional cost, you're not mandating alternative programs, you're mandating that everybody sits down and talks about it and tries to be, hopefully, creative in fashioning an education for a young person. Try to...don't let him be a statistic. I move for the advancement of the bill.
